

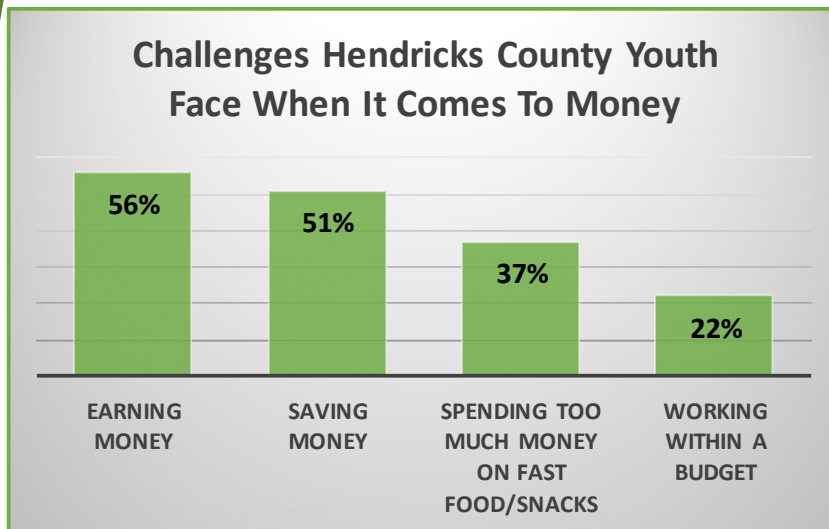
PARENTS: SURVEY REVEALS KIDS ACTUALLY DO WANT YOUR ADVICE, WHEN IT COMES TO \$\$\$

65% of youth desire to learn money skills from their parents, ranking higher than classroom & electronic tools
